## Monday, October 18, 2021

Adjust appropriately when dates fall on statutory holidays or weekends (per Interpretation Act)

### **Recommended Preliminary Actions**

Obtain the latest copies of the Local Authorities Election Act (LAEA), Municipal Government Act (MGA), Education Act (EA), Alberta Senate Elections Act (ASEA), Referendum Act

Provide prospective candidate packages (if applicable) – see Returning Officer Handbook for examples of items to include.

Ensure RO, SRO & all DROs have subscribed to the prescribed oath/statement prior to performing any duties such as receiving nomination papers

School divisions are required to take certain actions under sections 76 and 260 of the Education Act before Dec. 31, 2020.

This resource is designed to supplement the LAEA and the MGA and the dates and deadlines prescribed within. It is <u>not</u> designed to be a substitute for the relevant legislation or for legal advice. It should be reviewed throughout the duration of the election year to ensure adequate time for the resolutions and bylaws to be passed by councils.
